Arthur Mellows Village College Pupil Premium Funding

The Pupil Premium is funding paid to the school by means of a specific grant based on the following:

- School census figures for pupils registered as eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) in the last six years.
- The number of children who have been or are still in Local Authority Care.
- Children of parents in the Armed Forces.

The Pupil Premium is additional to main school funding and will be used by Arthur Mellows Village College to address any underlying inequalities and 'narrow the gap' in academic attainment for eligible pupils.

Pupil Premium money is not to be used to support individual children, but to benefit the learning of all children who attend Arthur Mellows Village College. However, the MAT is accountable for the attainment and progress of Pupil Premium identified children in respect to the Pupil Premium funding received and must therefore be able to justify the spending of Pupil Premium funds.

Pupil Premium Payments Calendar

Pupil Premium funding to the academy will be paid in quarterly instalments. In the 2019 to 2020 financial year, the funding will be paid in::

- July 2019
- October 2019
- January 2020
- April 2020

Pupil Premium breakdown is based on the designated use of these funds but can be subject to change throughout the academic year dependent on the needs of the academy.

Objectives for Pupil Premium at Arthur Mellows Village College

Research undertaken by the NFER has identified seven building blocks that are proven to be successful in raising attainment for disadvantaged children. Arthur Mellows Village College aspires towards fulfilling these points including:

- A whole school ethos of attainment for all children, not just those identified as Pupil Premium.
- Addressing behaviour and attendance.
- High quality teaching for all.
- Meeting individual learning needs through an inclusive experience for all.
- Deploying staff effectively to support all children.
- Data driven evidence to justify Pupil Premium expenditure.
- Clear, responsive leadership.

In response to the above statements, the Pupil Premium allowance for Arthur Mellows Village College will be used to provide additional educational support to improve the progress and raise the standard of achievement for identified pupils as well as all students within this school. This support will be available via:

- SEN support
- Support for behaviour for learning
- Provide learning opportunities for PP identified students to close inequalities
- Provide experiences for PP identified students to close inequalities
- Provide resources to enhance learning
- Improve the quality of teaching across Arthur Mellows Village College

Arthur Mellows Village College Policy for Pupil Premium

The funding will be used to narrow and close the gap between the achievement of those pupils identified as Pupil Premium and their peers. The academy will ensure the funding reaches the pupils who need it most and that it makes a significant impact on their education and lives via use of quality data analysis. The learning and experiences funded by pupil premium will be allocated based on evidence-based research as to the most effective practices. The impact of the use of the funding will be audited regularly in order to ensure it is being used effectively to close the gap for the eligible pupils.

Main Barriers for Learning

Pupil premium is utilised by Arthur Mellows Village College to “narrow the gap” between those children classed as being disadvantaged and those who are not. The funding is utilised to support against the main barriers to learning within the College cohort which includes:

- Socio-economic gaps between PP children and non PP children
- Lack of intrinsic motivation towards school
- Lack of external role modelling
- Attendance concerns
- Limited access to ICT based resources

Pupil Premium Accountability Statement

The Senior Management Team will regularly and rigorously monitor, evaluate and review the strategies put in place for Pupil Premium students.

A Pupil Premium member of staff is identified within the College to monitor the impact of Pupil Premium expenditure. They monitor the progress of students identified as such, in respect to their peers, give guidance and support to staff in respect of Pupil Premium and report to the Governing Body on its progress and impact.

Class teachers also have a responsibility to know who are their Pupil Premium students, and are accountable for the progress of these students, through appropriate planning teaching, assessment and classroom management.

Progress data will be available for analysis three times per annum.

Targeted Intervention in English (1 x FTE) £55,471	Extra staffing to provide specialist teaching at KS4 to support achievement in English. Also to provide after school clubs, targeted additional staffing, booster sessions and exams skills workshops.	
Targeted Intervention in Maths (1 x FTE) £55,471	Extra staffing to provide specialist teaching at KS4 to support achievement in Maths.	
Targeted Intervention in Science (0.5 x FTE) £27,736	Additional staffing used to provide after school clubs, targeted additional staffing, booster sessions and exam skills workshops.

Widening Parental Engagement £1000	A range of events designed to encourage parents of Pupil Premium students to play a more active role in their child's

Behaviour and Attendance Support Programme £5000	A support structure targeted at those with behaviour and attendance issues. This fund will allow for ongoing one to one support (mentoring, behaviour panel interventions etc)	
KS4 Achievement Coordinator £3000	Analysis and reporting of the progress and achievement of Pupil Premium students is carried out by the KS4 Achievement Coordinator.	
Breakfast Club for KS3 and KS4 Pupil Premium students £6000	Breakfast club for KS3 and KS4 Pupil Premium students. This club has an academic focus, but also includes a hot drink and meal to provide a good start to the day.	
Enrichment Activities for KS3 and KS4 £6000	Enrichment activities for Pupil Premium students whose achievement is better than expected. Activities are dependent on Year Group and are developing deeper, independent learning.	
Staff Training and INSET £4000	This will support staff in understanding Pupil Premium and how we as a College can provide the most effective support for Pupil Premium students.	
Resources £8,500	Development of teaching space and resources to accommodate Pupil Premium students, including computers and colour printing facilities.
